SUBJECT OVERVIEW

This apprenticeship will equip you with the skills and knowledge in the most popular basic treatments required by salons, as well as health and safety and promoting and selling. You will gain a desirable qualification that is sought after by salons and normally leads to progression on to Advanced Level Beauty, Massage or Nail Tech qualifications, helping you to increase your career prospects further. You will also have the opportunity to compete in the BROOKS annual Hair & Beauty Show.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Grade requirements: You will need a minimum of four GCSEs at grades A*-D or 9-3, including English and maths.

COURSE CONTENT

During this apprenticeship you will study a range of topics, including:

- Develop effectiveness at work
- Facial treatments
- Enhance lashes and brows
- Wax depilation treatments
- Manicures
- Pedicures
- Salon reception duties
- Make up services

You will be assessed via online exams for theory and client-based assessments for the practical units.
